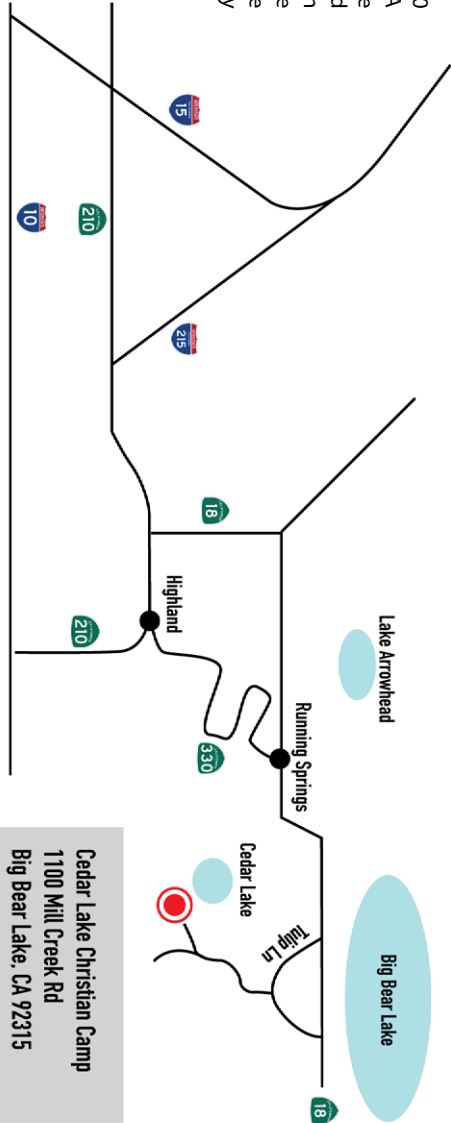
- For: Entering 5th-9th graders

THE SPIRIT OF TILDEN SUMMER CAMP

Tilden Summer Camp is a fun-filled adventure camp aimed at developing character and leadership skills among our campers. We instill in the boys the values of manliness, friendship, service to others, sportsmanship, teamwork, as well as a healthy spirit of competition and rivalry. Spiritual activities such as daily Mass and Rosary are also included in the schedule, and a chaplain is available for confession and spiritual guidance.

In addition to hobbies and sports, the daily schedule includes Holy Mass, Rosary, and reflections on the Scriptures and the Christian life. The chaplain will be available for confession daily. Senior staff also mentor the boys.

WHAT TO BRING

- Sleeping bag and a pillow
- Two books for reading, selected by parents with their kids
- Long pants and collared shirts for daily Mass
- Sports clothes: shorts and long pants, T-shirts, and sweatshirts
- Swimsuit and towel
- Water bottle or canteen for hikes
- Toiletries (soap, etc.) and personal medication
- Sun block and chapstick
- Flashlight and warm jacket for campfire at night
- Rosary
- Fishing pole and bait for pond fish (optional)

Prohibited items: knives, fireworks, matches, lighters, electronic games / devices. Cell phones and other cellular devices are prohibited and will be collected by the staff to be returned on the last day. Parents can contact the camp director, Matt Schoenecker, at 510-295-8734 if they need to speak with a camper. Campers can use one of the adult's phones to call home in case of an emergency.

APPLICATION

To be eligible for the Tilden Summer Camp, boys must be entering 5th-9th grade in the Fall of this year. An application must be submitted, which can be found at tildensc.org/wp/summer-camp. Applications are due June 5. The fee for the camp is \$425 per boy, or \$640 for two brothers. Checks should be made out to Tilden Study Center.



COUNSELORS

A few spots will be offered to 10-12th graders to work as volunteer counselors. These counselors help organize and run the camp, and they provide mentoring to the campers. Acceptance to a counselor position is based on leadership qualities and past experience. Counselors do not pay any fees.
